Upon failure of a person or corporation to perform such work in a manner satisfactory to the Selectboard, the Selectboard may complete such work at the expense of the permit or corporation and recover such expense in an action of tort on this statute, in the name of the Town of Grand Isle, with costs (Title 19 V.S.A. Section 1525).
